DOG OWNERS ARE ASKED TO SUBMIT LETTERS OR PETITIONS

Dog Owners are urged to submit letters or petitions to Shoalhaven City Council in relation to the Draft Dog Policy. Council is seeking feedback from members of the public in this regard and dog owners need to show they are in favour of the draft dog policy which is proposed to allow dogs on leash on all council managed beaches. It has been stated that the dog access policy should be simplified to relieve public confusion and to create a balance for dog lovers and those who don't want dogs on beaches. It is now proposed that dogs will be permitted on all beaches with nominated off leash areas.

There are areas where dogs will not be permitted, including near playgrounds, schools and food preparation areas, as well as shorebird nesting sites and flagged swimming areas. Dogs will also be allowed on any council reserves or public places providing they are kept on a leash.

Twenty-four hour off leash areas will include Washerwomans Beach at Bendalong, Cormorant Beach at Bawley Point and Milton Showground.

The current proposal will be on display on council's website and at council's offices in Nowra and Ulladulla.
